

Demystifying Masonic Symbols

If you're pressed for time, you can go directly to Freemason Symbols, however for a truer understanding of why Freemasons use symbols, please continue reading this, first.

Many Freemason symbols teach moral lessons through the use of allegory. (Allegory is when you liken one thing to another thing).

Learning the allegorical meanings of Freemasonry's many symbols is not difficult, but it can be easy to confuse the difference between a symbol and an emblem. Some writers use these two words somewhat interchangeably and it is easy to see why.

WHAT IS A SYMBOL?

Symbols represent a more complex idea by use of the "face value" of a graphical image.

A symbol compares one thing with another using a graphical, visual object as a memory aid. A symbol has both a visual "face value" and a secondary more complex meaning which has been ascribed to it. In other words, a symbol brings to mind a "story" behind it.

Masonic symbols usually have a secondary or higher religious or spiritual meaning ascribed to them.

Example: Masonic Setting Maul



The Masonic setting maul symbol has the face value of its basic use to an operative Mason as that of a tool to set stones. To speculative Masons, it has a secondary meaning which represents a more complex idea or concept such as the manner in which Hiram Abif met his death.

WHAT IS AN EMBLEM?

Emblems represent a specific group, quality or type.

Emblems have a "face value" only. Most of the time, you can remember the difference if you think: Emblem = Group.

An emblem is an insignia, crest, patch, a trademark or logo. It is a special design or visual object representing a quality, type or group.

The Masonic square and compasses emblem represents Freemasonry as a group. It is their logo. It should also be noted that the Masonic square and compasses logo is copyrighted.

Some Masonic symbols originated in the Holy Scriptures, which was originally written in Hebrew. A few of them are:

Boaz and Jachin:

The ornate pillars which stood on both sides of the entrance to King Solomon's temple; (1 Kings 7:13-22)

Acacia:

The Holy Scriptures tell us that acacia was used to construct most of the sacred furniture and the tabernacle within King Solomon's temple. (Exodus 25:10 and Ezekial 27:19)





Caring for Your Lodge's Records

It's human to accumulate things. Masonic lodges are no different. Only in some cases, they've accumulated a century or more's worth of things piling up in the attic. From books to papers to photos and all manner of knick-knacks, it's hard for even the most seasoned lodge secretary to know what to do with it all.

But before you call in the junk-removal guys, take a second to make an inventory of what materials your lodge is hanging on to, since when it comes to Masonic records, not everything is created equal. Here, Joseph Evans, 16 the collections manager for the Henry Wilson Coil Library and Museum of Freemasonry and the head archivist for the Grand Lodge of California, gives us the skinny on what we can—and can't—clear out of the basement.

Understanding What's What in the Lodge Attic

The Henry Wilson Coil Library and Museum of Freemasonry is home to thousands of Masonic books, archives, and objects that, taken together, tell the story of Freemasonry in California and beyond. But amassing that collection has been the work of generations. And that means having an eye for what is, and isn't, extraneous. "It's important to understand that there are different types of records," Evans says. "There are the records a lodge creates as part of their everyday business, like membership rolls and tiler's books, and then there are objects and curiosities it collects over the years." This differentiation is important, because as nonprofit entities, Masonic lodges have a greater responsibility to preserve one type of record over the other.

To help lodge officials understand those distinctions, Evans has created a **Retention Schedule** that lodges can refer to that lists what types of records need to be kept and for how long. (The retention schedule is located in iMember, under the "Resources" tile, titled "Inventory and Records Retention Information.") Evans has also written a guide explaining what kinds of records should be kept, and how to do it. Some records, like annual and semi-annual financial reports, are considered permanent records and should be kept forever. Other types of records, like bank deposits, must be held for at least seven years—but can be tossed after that. "This schedule was produced as a way of answering the question of how long documents need to be kept," Evans explains.

The retention schedule only deals with official documents, though—not things like letters, photographs, or other lodge paraphernalia. In that case, it's up to the members of the lodge what to keep or not—although as an archivist, Evans tends to favor organizing and preserving those things. Taken together, they represent the lodge's material culture and help tell a more complete story of its past. "Generally speaking, I would recommend holding on to the lodge's ephemera," Evans says, citing things like "the event brochures, menus, photo albums, and scrapbooks. Those tell the story of your lodge."

Once you've organized the clutter and determined what records need to be kept and which can be tossed, it's important to store them properly. This can be a fairly significant effort, but one that's well worth the cost.

There are two important rules to follow when it comes to archiving material: First, keep things out of direct sunlight, which causes material to fade, crack, and disintegrate, and away from damp, which can cause mold to grow. The other bugaboo is pests or rodents, which can chew through just about anything. Wherever your lodge stores its records should be dry, cool, and clear of food, plants, or anything else that may attract insects or critters.

In general, Evans says, store archival material in cardboard boxes rather than plastic bins. Though sturdier than cardboard, plastic containers don't allow for proper air circulation and can lead to mold growth. Label boxes with a list of its contents so you know what's in them without having to rummage through them, and then store them safely away. "In the end, I'm just an email away if lodges have any questions about what should or shouldn't be tossed and how to properly store those records that need to be kept."

HEALTH TIPS

SIEZURE WHAT IS SEIZURE?

Is a sudden involuntary muscle contraction, usually due to uncontrolled electrical activity in the brain.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- * Local tingling or twitching in part of the body.
- * Brief blackout or period of confused behavior
- * Sudden falling, loss of consciousness Drooling, frothing of the mouth.
- CAUSES OF SEIZURES
- * EPILEPTIC SEIZURES- due to epilepsy; congenital defect to the brain before delivery.
- * Vices-bad hobbit- usually due to trauma to the women, medications, disease or vices of woman during pregnancy.
- * STRUCTURAL SEIZURE- due to fluid/ electrolyte imbalance in the brain like hunger, thirst, poisoning, diabetes and withdrawal syndrome.
- * FEBRILE SEIZURE- (convulsion) due to high grade body temperature, common in children.
- * PARTIAL SEIZURE- (focal seizure)- focal twitching, unusual sights smells, sounds etc.
- * Generalized tonic chronic seizure (grand-malseizure- sudden falling or loss of consciousness, vigorous muscles spasm, twitching, jerking, stiffening. Loss of bowel & bladder control, temporary cease of breathing.
- * ABSENCE SEIZURE (Petit-mal-seizure) brief blackout (20 secs.) or period of confusion, sudden loss of consciousness without loss of motor functioning.

REMINDER: However, you should call physician when someone having seizure also is pregnant, carries identification as a diabetic, is in the water & has swallowed large amount of water.

TODAY IN MASONIC HISTORY

Benjamin Thomas Biggs is Born

Today in Masonic History Benjamin Thomas Biggs is born in 1821

Benjamin Thomas Biggs was an American farmer and politician.

Biggs was born near Bohemia Manor, Cecil County, Maryland on October 1st, 1821. For school he attended the Methodist Pennington Seminary and Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut.

During the Mexican-American war, Biggs was appointed as a Major in the Delaware Militia. Around this same time, he married Mary Beekman. The couple had 5 children. The family resided in Middletown, New Castle County, Delaware where the he resided for the rest of his life.

Biggs worked the land the family owned as well as additional property across the state line in Maryland. He was largely a peach farmer. Though his passion was for public speaking and quickly became involved in public affairs. He first joined the Whig Party and later joined the Democratic party. It should be noted Delaware Democrats generally tracked in their philosophy with southern Democrats meaning anti-abolition and prostates' rights. It is unclear if Biggs shared in all of the policies of the party, as little is available for legislation he specifically sponsored.



21 In 1860, Biggs ran for a seat in the United States House of Representatives. He lost to a candidate from the People's Party, George P. Fisher. Most people knew little of Fisher's political stance on many of the hot button issues of the day. As the Civil War broke out, most of the Democratic leaning state of Delaware were not happy with their selection. In 1868, Biggs ran again and this time was elected largely on the anger in Delaware of having suffered the humiliation of Federal supervision in the last elections and the few slaves in Delaware being forcibly freed by the Federal Government. Biggs time in the House of Representatives was uneventful. He served until 1873. At the time he served Democrats were a largely powerless minority in Congress.

Over the next twenty years, Delaware was no different from any state in the deep South. In fact, for many of those twenty years Republicans did not even put forth a candidate for Governor. In 1886, Biggs was nominated for Governor. His run for office was the last unopposed by a Republican candidate. He did face an opponent from the Temperance Reform party, this was largely a token opposition and Biggs easily defeated the candidate.

During Biggs term he spent most of his time, like the Governors who came before him during the previous twenty years trying to get the State Legislature to pass reforms to the voting system and other issues. Again, like his predecessors he was not able to get them to pass any legislation. The one exception was the establishment of a State Hospital for the Insane, which is still in operation. He left office January of 1891.

Biggs passed away at his home in Middletown, Delaware on December 25th, 1893. Biggs was a member of Union Lodge No. 5 in Middletown, Delaware.
