

MASONIC EDUCATION

Masonic All-Seeing Eye

The Masonic Eye is symbolic of the Eye of God. It is the symbol of His Divine watchfulness and His ever present care of the universe.



The All-Seeing Eye, like many other Masonic symbols, has been borrowed from the past from the nations of antiquity.

Hebrews and Egyptians

Both the Hebrews and Egyptians appear to have derived the use of the Masonic Eye from the natural inclination of figurative minds to select a human organ as the symbol of its closest matching function...much as the foot denotes swiftness, the arm, strength and the hand, fidelity.

Psalm 34:15: "The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry."

Psalm 121:4: "Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep."

From the Book of Conversation of God with Moses on Mount Sinai, translated by the Reverend W. Cureton, taken from an Arabic manuscript of the 15th century and published by the Philobiblon Society of London:

"Then Moses said to the Lord, O' Lord, dost thou sleep or not?

The Lord said unto Moses:

"I never sleep: but take a cup and fill it with water."

Then, Moses took a cup and filled it with water, as the Lord commanded him.

Then, the Lord cast into the heart of Moses the breath of slumber; so he slept, and the cup fell from his hand and the water which was therein was spilled.

Then Moses awoke from his sleep.

Then God said to Moses:



HEALTH TIPS DIARY

SOFT TISSUE INJURIES

WOUND- is a break in the continuity of a tissue of the body either internal or external.

(2) CLASSIFICATION OF WOUND:

CLOSED WOUND

Causes:

- Blunt object result in contusion or bruises.
- Application of external forces.
- (By an accidents)

Signs and Symptoms

- *Pain and tenderness
- *Hematoma
- *Swelling
- *Uncontrolled restlessness*Dislocation
- *Thirst

Symptoms of shock

- *Vomiting or coughing-up blood
- *Passage of blood in the urine or feces
- *Signs of blood along mouth, nose and ear canal.

FIRST AID MANAGEMENT:

1.) ICE APPLICATION; 2.) SPLINTING

OPEN WOUND

Classification of OPEN WOUND

P- Penetrating pointed instruments such as nails, ice picks, dagger, etc.

A-Scrapping or rubbing against rough surfaces

L-Blunt instruments such as shrapnel's, rock, broken glasses, etc.

A-Explosion, animal bites, mishandling of tools, etc

I-Sharp bladed instruments such as blades, razor, etc.

DANGERS:

- Hemorrhage
- Infection
- Shock

KINDS of BLEEDING:

- Arterial Bleeding
- Venous Bleeding
- Capillary Bleeding

FIRST AID MANAGEMENT (Wound with Severe Bleeding)

- C- control bleeding
- C- cover the wound with dressing & secure with blanket
- C –care for shock
- C- consult or refer to the physician
 - Wound with bleeding not severe (home care)
 - Clean the wound with soap and water
 - o Apply mild antiseptics or antibiotic ointment/cream
 - Cover wound with dressing and bandage

REMINDERS:

All wounds must be thoroughly inspected and covered

with a dry dressing to control bleeding and prevent

further contamination.

• Once bleeding is controlled by compression, the limb

should be splinted to further control bleeding, stabilize

the injured part, minimize the victim's pain and facilitate

the patients transport to the hospital.

• Use elastic bandage to secure dressing and to



TODAY IN MASONIC HISTORY

George Everest Passed Away

Today in Masonic History George Everest Passed Away in 1866,

George Everest was a Welsh surveyor and geographer.

Everest was born on July 4th, 1790 in Crickhowell in Powys, Wales.

In 1818, Everest was commissioned in the Royal Artillery. He was assigned to be the assistant to Colonel William Lambton. Lambton had started the Great Trigonometrical Survey of the subcontinent in 1806. In 1823 when Lambton passed away, Everest succeeded him as the superintendent of the survey.

In 1830, Everest was appointed as the Surveyor-General of India.

In 1832, Everest built his home in Mussoorie, Uttarakhand, India. The house was situated in a way one side of the house looks out over the

Doon Valley and the other looks out over the Aglar River valley. It also has views of the snow-covered Himalayas. The house includes a laboratory Everest used as well. There have long been plans to turn the house into a museum. Unfortunately, the house has since fallen into disarray, though. It is almost completely stripped of contents. In the yard there are deep cisterns, actively used when Everest lived there. Unfortunately, they have now become a danger to people and animals because they are open.


In 1843, Everest retired and returned to Great Britain. Once there he became a Fellow of the Royal Society. In 1862 he was elected as the vice-president of the Royal Geographical Society.

In 1865, Mount Everest was renamed in honor of Everest and to translate it into the English language by the Royal Geological Society. Everest was opposed to this change and wanted to see the name remain what it was in Nepal, which is Sagarmāthā and in Tibet, which is Chomolungma.

Everest passed away on December 1st, 1866.

Everest was initiated into Neptune Lodge No. 441. He later joined the Prince of Wales Lodge No. 493 (previously No. 259) in February of 1829.
